

## **WALKING CONTINUUM**

Signs saying “Strongly Agree” and “Strongly Disagree” are placed at opposite ends of the room, and one saying “Not Sure” on the wall in the middle of the room to indicate a continuum of opinion. A list of statements is read and participants are asked to move the area of the room that indicates how much they agree or disagree with the statements.

Rock music is harmful to kids.

Religion & politics should never mix.

Clothes make the person.

Sex outside of marriage is okay.

Money is not important to me.

Honesty is always the best policy.

Keeping traditions is important to me.

The opinions of my peers affect what I do.

Everybody lies.

A good education is vital to survival.

Marijuana should be legalized.

People are basically good at heart.

The city curfew is a good thing.

The drinking age should be lowered to 18.

Parents have the right to search their kid’s room.

Students should be given a zero if they get caught cheating on a test.

You can take as much time as you have to discuss participants’ basis for their opinions.

Would their answers change if one word in the statement was different?

Encourage discussion, respect and acceptance of the views of other group members.
